### **Frequently Asked Questions**

## 1. Does the learner need to pay for the "SSG Grant Amount" using SkillsFuture credits?

No. The "SSG Grant Amount" is not the same as SkillsFuture credits.

NUS will claim the "SSG Grant Amount" directly from SSG.\* The learner or corporate sponsor needs to pay only the amount indicated in the last row of the fee schedule: "Total Nett Programme Fee Payable, Including GST, after additional funding from the various funding schemes".

\*Terms and conditions to be assessed competent and eligible for the SSG funding: Learners must fulfill at least 75% attendance and pass all assessment components. There are no tests/exams in the CET for Educators courses. The courses are seminar-style with a presentation of a lesson plan in the third session.

#### 2. When is payment due?

For self-sponsored participants, payment is due upon accepting the offer of placement in the course.

For corporate-sponsored participants, invoice is issued upon commencement of the course. Payment to be made according to payment term.

### 3. What about SkillsFuture credits?

SkillsFuture credits may be used by self-sponsored participants to pay for the amount in the last row of the fee schedule: "Total Nett Programme Fee Payable, Including GST, after additional funding from the various funding schemes". The SkillsFuture credits are available to Singapore citizens aged 25 years and older.

## 4. Can we use MOE IFAAS for payment?

Payment via MOE IFAAS is not preferred. After the corporate-sponsored participant has completed the course, NUS will submit the invoice to the Government & Aided School customer code via Vendors@Gov and the School can make payment by Giro. The amount to be paid is in the last row of the fee schedule: "Total Nett Programme Fee Payable, Including GST, after additional funding from the various funding schemes". Please ask the school administrator to contact Carrie (chmwst@nus.edu.sg).

# 5. How do I know if I am eligible for the "additional funding"?

You are eligible for the additional funding if you are a Singapore citizen, aged 40 years old or older. This additional funding is available to Singapore citizens who turn 40 the year that the course is taken, even if the course is completed on or before your birthday.

Additional funding for SMEs will typically not apply to educators.
